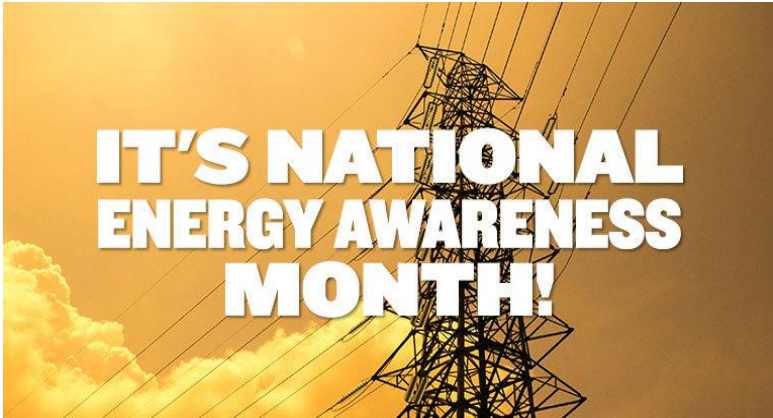

AUBURN
FIRE HYDRANT TESTING IN OCTOBER

Look and listen for newspaper and radio broadcasts on specific dates for fire hydrant testing that will be done in October throughout Auburn.

BPW will operate all 200 fire hydrants to make certain they are functional.

Customers may find temporary discoloration of their water during this period. The water does remain safe to drink, but you should run water clear before washing clothes.

As a reminder and to avoid a late fee, payments should be mailed ten days prior to the due date to ensure that the payment is received on time. We highly recommend making your payments online (*see instructions below*) but if you choose to mail in your payment, please make sure you submit the remittance page or write your account number on your check.

To set up your Xpress Bill Pay account:

1. Go to www.xpressbillpay.com
2. Click on the Sign-Up tab and “New to Xpress Bill Pay?” will pop up to allow you to complete the short registration form including your email address and password.
3. An email will be sent to you to verify and add a new bill. Select your billing organization (Auburn BPW) and follow the prompts for linking your bill. Note...you will need your BPW account number.
4. Once your bill is linked to your account, you will receive email notifications when your bill is available to view online as well as having the option to set-up auto pay.

I am a registered voter in the County of Nemaha, Nebraska. I hereby declare, under penalty of election falsification, that these statements are true, to be the best of my knowledge. Requesting an absentee ballot eliminates your right to vote at your polling place in this election. The penalty for election falsification is imprisonment for up to five (5) years or a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) or both.
